			1. The property currently containing the golf course must remain open space for all time. This means thinking long term – very long term. It means no housing, no new buildings, no new roads, no new permanent structures. There are many ways that this property can remain open space and benefit the citizens of our town – including, but not limited to golf. I find it helpful to ask myself "what will the citizens of Port Townsend 150 years from now be very grateful that we did with the golf course?" Personally, I think they will be glad we kept it open space. The golf course property may one day be the "Central Park" of Port Townsend when the city has grown to levels that we, today, can hardly imagine. And although, as we all know, we desperately need more affordable housing the 59 acres of the golf course property is the wrong place. We have hundreds of acres of buildable land all over the place – including uptown even. We have hundreds of acres of city owned, county owned, state owned, privately owned land for building.	
			2. The property currently containing the golf course must contribute to mitigating climate change. This might mean more trees , different kinds of trees, other ways to sequester carbon. But as city leaders you absolutely must take a bold and public stand for mitigating climate change – not so much for what contribution 59 acres can make (it is not insignificant) but more the leadership and inspiration it can show to all of us since it will be visible and will likely engage many of us if not most of us.

natural history features/values/importance of the course. There is some literature, and I have personal experience, to suggest that golf courses are often important natural history areas. While most of the published research and literature is from other parts of the US, several geographic regions are represented ranging from southwest deserts to the sub-tropical southeast of Florida. The mixture of water features, edge habitats, and open areas provide an excellent diversity of habitats, especially for birds. This is particularly important in urban and urbanized areas. For example, the Carnation golf course outside Seattle is a well know destination for the East Lake Washington Audubon Society. The Port Townsend golf course has some excellent habitat features. I have recorded 70 species of birds at the PT Golf Course, without making any special effort, just noting different birds as I played a round of golf. Golf courses are often better wildlife habitat than places like city parks because there is less human disturbance. Golfers do not venture into "natural" areas unless looking for a lost ball, whereas kids love to explore the most inaccessible areas of parks. Also, city parks do not typically have "unmanaged' wetlands, meadows and forests, instead they are manicured. The pond and adjacent wetlands at the Port Townsend golf course are examples of excellent, unmanaged urban wildlife habitat. Is there someone who understands the importance of habitat diversity in urban areas currently on your "stakeholders" committee?

In your deliberations regarding the future of the golf course, I wonder if you are considering the Thanks so much for your comments and thoughts about the habitat of the golf course. Looking through the agenda packet for Council's Monday workshop, I see you are deep into the process for the golf course. Unless I overlooked it, I see no reference to a second restricted/protected area at the golf course, the area now referred to as Hastings Pond. The whole course was once called Spring Valley Golf Course and what was the 'spring' is now the pond and wetland, with four acres protected, at least in theory (it has been repeatedly mistreated by current lessee, in my opinion). I have attached the page in Appendix A from the 2020 PROS Plan that speaks to the protections on both the pond/wetland area and the prairie, both listed as critical areas. If we had no debt and a large cash reserve, then our choices would undoubtedly be different than they need to be in light of our current financial state. We can't afford to pave our streets. We have tens of millions of dollars of debt, owed by a community of fewer than 10,000 people. And, along with the denial by our public officials that this is a problem, we permit the ongoing increase in infrastructure spending, knowing that 25 to 50 years from now we will not have the money to maintain and/or replace that infrastructure, unless we take it from future generations. Almost every city and town in America has done this, which is one of the reasons that our national infrastructure is so badly deteriorated. I know how tempting perpetual growth is to public officials. They can permit an infrastructure project today which will bring in money, maybe lots of it, while the bill for maintaining and then replacing that infrastructure is put off for a generation or two until someone else is in office. So my first wish is that we not do that.

Applying that caveat, if the golf course can be run as a business that does not cost the City anything, great, do that. If it is a net gain to the City, even better. If, however, we need to spend money to keep it afloat, on irrigation, on mowing and/or on infrastructure maintenance, money not completely matched by income from the golf course operations, then please do not do that. Close the golf course; Don't irrigate it; don't mow it; leave it as an unmaintained, wild space – yes, I know that it may eventually revert to a 59-acre blackberry patch. The point is, we do not need any more unnecessary infrastructure spending.

I did hear the word "environment" used but as the moderator noted that word by itself means little (or everything). I think I'm a little anxious about this. From where I

I think that a lot of the criteria that the stakeholders came up with directly impacts climate change and I heard sit, climate change seems to be a challenge of existential proportions. To me it is the single biggest challenge of this century – a challenge that will determine if we (humans) will even have another century. I understand very well that many people see things differently. But I truly hope that as this group moves forward there will be some kind of recognition that some principles really are more important than others. To me this list of possible principles needs to be reviewed from the perspective of "what two or three principles really are the most important here?". For example, much as I love (and financially support) the Recyclery, I do not think infrastructure for the recyclery is remotely as important as climate change. To me it's like comparing taking away my smart-phone versus taking away my oxygen. I know that taking my granddaughter's i-phone away would feel life threatening to her but taking her oxygen away would take her life away quickly. I would love to see the recyclery get lots of help as an outcome of this project – but even more I would love the discussion to get focused more at the level of what we, the citizens of this town, could do to make the golf course (and related properties) outcome have a significant educational and practical impact on climate change.

I think upgrades to the practice facility will attract more golfers and an addition of a putt putt area could attract more families- getting children involved in the sport at an earlier age similar to the soccer and little league that occurs in PT. The club house boasts an amazing view and upgrades to the building could see a world class restaurant and bar. It is a great place to grab a drink or eat in addition to playing golf- however the facility is not up to date and the advertisements for the current restaurant and bar are not wide spread. While there are many issues mentioned in these plans, I feel that one in particular stands out as a shared value that many parties could support: resilience, or emergency preparedness. Surely the conversation around this publicly owned space could be centered on such a common need. Focusing on emergency preparedness is already part of the local culture of Jefferson County with our All County Picnic, our strong response to COVID-19, and our remote and rural location here on the Olympic Peninsula. Given that the property in question is also near the center of Port Townsend, adjacent to our local Red Cross, Police Station, and down the hill from the Fire Department it is positioned to support the community quite well. Practically, this vision could go many directions, but in order to appease the advocates of the golf course's existing "open green space" and meet the needs of our broader community, I would suggest keeping the resilience additions focused. Key aspects that could be pursued include perennial food production, water harvest and storage, energy generation, and a gathering place. Food production: I am not suggesting starting a new farm (yet) on this land, but considering the planting of fruit and nut trees, a food forest, that does not require the same needs as annual crops. This region can grow a wide variety of fruits including apples, pears, figs, plums and nut trees including hazelnut and chestnut. There are many growers on this Peninsula who could inform or lead such an effort. Water Harvest and Storage: When a major earthquake strikes this region, we will be lucky to avoid waterline disruption and damage. Where will our water come from in this event? Water bottles serve an immediate need, but we must consider medium term solutions that take advantage of water as our greatest natural resource. We can harvest and store water on-site in cisterns, below or above ground grade. Why not include an iconic water tower for this iconic town? It can become a point of pride and imagery for this place. Energy Generation: Similar to water, our energy system will be massively disrupted during a major earthquake. Where will local people go to gather in a place that has light and warmth? There already is some development at the corner that is not part of the golf course property.7.There are many other possible locations, as the course is bounded by four main streets: the aforementioned two plus Cherry and Blaine.8.A 10 acre piece of land could accommodate at least 150 closely-spaced, small single-family houses with a little space for community facilities. The houses would be more affordable, if they would be townhouses or lowrise apartments and it makes sense to dedicate a large portion of the 10 acres to that kind of development. That would significantly increase the number overall housing units on those 10 acres and really would really boost the quantity of affordable housing in this city.9.So why locate housing at the golf course property?a. The golf course is owned by the City. There would be no land cost, which is typically 1/3rd of the development cost. So cost saving.b. There is a lot of acreage and not all of it needs to be used for recreational purposes.c. The golf course is surrounded by main streets, which probably have major utilities in place. (cost) d. Depending on the location of the housing, the site could have good transit access.e. Depending on the housing location, there could be reasonable access to stores and services. f. 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Helio, I previously commented on the future of the golf course but my thoughts have evolved so this is an update. I am sending this to city officials and Engage Port Townsend. I strongly believe that city parks should be accessible yet have a role in maintaining open space and natural habitat. They also offer an educational opportunity to emphasize the values of open space and natural habitat. My hope is that the golf course becomes a more accessible, more natural, open landscape, with native plant communities, and that there is no hard surface or other hard development. Its history as part of the lowland between Townsend Bay and North Beach with intermittent wetlands, and its use by indigenous peoples, should be deliberately included through signage and landscape plans. The golf course is beneficial as de facto open space and a recreational opportunity, but for a limited population. It is a highly modified unnatural landscape where non-native plants like Himalayan blackberry, English holly and English laurel are now common, trees including native Douglas fir and non-native Lombardy poplar form artificial rows, and intensive maintenance and resource inputs like irrigation are required. Instead, I hope to see native plant communities in a natural landscape, managed as habitat for birds and other wildlife as appropriate, completely or largely replace the golf course. Kah Tai Prairie and the wetland must be preserved and should be expanded. Low impact walking trails should be created to welcome and increase access by the greater community beyond golfers. If the area becomes a mixed-use park, including some form of golf, those uses should occur on a minority portion of the current golf course area and should have limited impact on the majority portion natural landscape and the environment. Increased access and mixed use are plausible but should complement the natural landscape and not come at its expense. If some form of golf is included, and I recognize the golf course is important to some, advocates are encouraged to reach out to the public with ideas and be open to compromise. The economics are challenging but with creativity a solution should be achievable. For background I live with my family including our 6th grade child, three blocks from the golf course. The golf course is between home and my daughter's school is, but the golf course has never welcomed those of us who are non-golfers, neither its infrastructure, signage or staff. Uneasiness over that issue could be solved if the Council and City Manager would simply state plainly - no housing. I would love to stop harping on it.2.I am left with one very disturbing issue being bantered about - moving the pool/gym/exercise complex to the golf course. Seems to me the shear size of the complex and necessary parking would greatly encroach on the golf course. Considering the Prairie will be left in place, the only way to expand such a large structure (and sufficient parking) would be to take out the practice area, the golf workshop, and a large part of hole # 1. (assuming the logical place to site it would be where the current golf office/restaurant sits) Not only would such a large structure loom over the Course, but would greatly diminish the future Course manager ability to efficiently manage his business.3. The current location of the pool is the most logical, and likely the least expensive choice for the pool complex. Wherever it is built, the cost of removing the old pool and building would have to be done, so wouldn't it be most cost effective to make demolition and new construction an all inclusive contract. (I remember the Council presentation made by Jeff Randall some years ago displaying a very good fit for the new complex on the existing site - I also remember his estimate of 8 to 12 million dollars)4. Three other small issues. First - if the pool complex includes health club amenities like racquetball, weights, and exercise machines, the two local Health Clubs would be put out of business - is that really what we want to do to existing local business? Also, a question was asked - what recreation is planned for teens and younger on the Course? - the obvious answer is GOLF! A competent Course Manager would definitely develop youth golf programs. Finally, I noticed the flow chart that displayed the process from study to plan to decision appeared to show the Council receiving a single option rather than a range ((at least 2 or 3) of options. Is that your intent? I look forward to future interaction with the planners and especially the City Council.

Many people think that by paying rent, the golf course provides a net income to the City. But it seems this may not be true. It appears from the City website postings that golf course uses over 7,000,000 gallons of City water for irrigation, and some addition smaller amount in the facilities (cafe, restroom, & general use). As a 45 year resident of Port Townsend, I have visited this property infrequently. My family and I visit the Kah Tai Prairie in the spring, and imagine what it must have looked like centuries ago. Many thanks to the indigenous maintainers of this prairie, and to the Native Plant Society and City for saving even a small, 1.4 acre of native prairie. I visit the golf course regularly to cross country ski when it snows, which is a rare occurrence. In the past, the Pond was a vibrant community gathering place for ice skating, with a donated box of skates on the former island, so that people without skates could participate. All generations came out to play hockey, twirl and jump, be pulled on sleds, and learn to skate. This ended when the golf course management refused access to the pond, and called the police to clear everyone off. Needless to say, community members felt extremely unwelcome! However, due to rising temperatures, it has been years since skating has been possible on the pond. While I would like to walk on the property, it is too dangerous to do so while people are playing golf. My preference is for the property to be redesigned so that more than a small number of people who play golf can enjoy the space. A plan that is more inclusive, ecologically sound, and accessible to all residents is desirable.

I am a Port Townsend resident. I'm in my 30s and I rent an apartment in town. I work in public the feasability of that is really tied to housing and affordability and availablity going forward. When I started seeing the lawn signs in support of preserving the golf course and the 'open green space" I immediatly felt concerned that this might be the only prespective on this project that was engaging in meanigful community organinzing, even though I know that there are many people here who share prespectives like mine. I've worked in the enviornmental field in the past, doing ecological restoration. I've volunteered at Kah Tai Prairie and I think it's an important space and should absolutly be preserved in any iteration of this project. However, a golf course is not high quality green space. It's not a restored habitat, densely populated with native plants, that would be playing a more important role for our local ecosystem. Golf is a niche sport with significant buy-in expenses that requires a huge amount of carefully manicured land. Tis land is not particularly accessible to the general public; it;s for golfer. We also have data demonstrating that this gold course is not thriving financially. I would live to see this land out to uses that better serve the current and emerging needs in our community. I know that we have a profound needfor more affordable and middle housing options. I can imagine that the space would be used significantly more if it were repurposed for any number of possible projects, since the golf course itself is a restrictive use of land. Some of it could be set aside for proper habitat resotration. The survey put out by the city offered a number of great options. I think the worst outcome would be for this high-value, centrally located land to continue to sit as-is. In our current society, where we're seeing a tremendous national housing crisis amoung other issues, having a golf course within city limits is simply poor land use, and it certainly has no place in a community that's looking to the future and trying to serve the actual needs of its residents.

Fencing is a great sport that supports both physical and mental fitness, and is playable by people age 7 to 80+(there are even offical competition brackets for age 80 and over.). Facilities can range from fairly modest to fairly large, but have fairly simple needs (open indoor space and some electrical and cable instalations). If run in a similar way to the pool, a couple of employees with some fencing experience could manage guests and maintain a pool of equipment that could be lent to those who do not have their own. Ideally, one or more instructors could be found and contracted to provide lessons as well. I saw this letter to the editor and it absolutlely addresses my thoughts on the golf course. The golf course is NOT a good use of our funds. I hope the new group we hired can provide a much better and more inclusive alternative: In last week's letter to the editor titled "golf course benifits" team for their consideration. Thank you so much for taking the time to send your thoughts. entire community" the autor concludes by asking, "There is only one skate park, would we take that out as not everyone uses it?" This is a false analogy as the skate park is .33 acres wheras the golf course is 58 acres, or 174 times the size of the skate park. If the skate park were 58 acres, would anyone say that was a good use of public land? Why do we allow golfers, who represent a tiny fraction of the population, to monopolize so much space? By the golf course's own numbers, a paltry 32 rounds of golf were played the entire month of August 2022, or just over one round/day! In all of 2021, ther were 212 rounds played, or .58 rounds/day. If it takes about two hours to play a round of golf, this means that the golf course sat empty approximatly 95 percent of the year with it being used by a single golfer the other 5 percent. If you don't believe me, just drive past the golf course almost any time of the day. Furthermore, unlike the golf course, the skate park doesn't use vast sums of water, supplied by the city at zero cost. According the lease agreement, the golf course enjoys up to 9 million gallons of city water per year free of charge while playing a mere 6.5 percent of sales (or \$10K, whichever is greater) in taxes. The skate park also doesn't require large quanties of fertilizers and gasoline, both of which are damaging to our enviornment. In other words, the golf course is a poor use of public land, and one that would argue is a net loss for our community and enviornment as opposed to a net benifit. Thankfully, ther is something you can do to help right this wrong. Please consider submitting a comment at cityofpt.us, attending the open house form 5 to 7 p.m. Wednesday, Jan 11 at the Fort Worden Commons, and talking with your friends and neighbors about the issue. Public opinion will play an important tole in the city's decision about future of the golf course. The S'Klallam tribe, who own the Dungeness Golf Course in Sequim, currently have this kind contractual arrangement with the Peninsula Golf Club in Port Angeles for running their pro shop. As to the maintenance of the course, my sense is that two to three full-time positions, assuming one has substantial greens keeping experience, could achieve the needed upgrades and sustained course quality to achieve positive revenue for the city, particularly with the strong volunteer group at the PT course. Being parks department employees, these workers could also be assigned work at other parks facilities where appropriate.2. A second very different approach to the future management of the PT Golf Course would involve approaching regional tribes with proven track records in ownership and management of golf courses whether they'd be interested in taking on the upgrade and running of the PT course. Two obvious choices are the Jamestown S'Klallam tribe who own the Cedars at Dungeness Golf Course in Sequim and the Suquamish Indian Tribe who own the White Horse Golf Course in Kingston. A recent letter to the Leader gently suggested giving the golf course property back to the Indians. I'm sure this is not on the table for the PT course, but might there be a regional tribe who would be interested in a very long-term lease? While, according to the consultant, 74% of respondents to the survey supported alternative or hybrid uses of the golf course, the lack of creativity and imagination in regard to those alternative uses is disappointing. These options are just rehashes of old ideas, nothing new, nothing directed toward solving our most pressing and urgent issue. An opportunity missed. It is, as a friend recently said, "designed for the haves, not the have nots". It is clear to me that additional open space and parks are of small concern when weighed against the lack of housing in our city. One of the most cited reason that people move here is the abundance of outdoor recreational activities and natural beauty. Of all of the answers to your survey the most telling are the responses from high school students. The next generation of adults in our community want to see affordable housing on this land. That is their number one choice for both the golf course and Mt. View. How can we ignore them? It is time to listen to the children. They are rightfully and urgently concerned about whether they will be able to live here. We have a responsibility to at least provide some opportunities. Our legacy so far is not very admirable. The entire golf course needs to become a planned residential community, embracing a variety of housing styles and sizes, types and levels of affordability, multiple concepts in a park like setting. Converting publicly owned property into housing can remove the cost of land from the equation while still preserving the opportunity for home ownership and affordable rentals. There could be clusters of tiny homes adjacent to cooperatively owned and managed multifamily apartments located near community gardens and playgrounds; townhouses, duplexes and cottage housing connected by walking trails: boarding houses with community kitchens could serve the needs of many single folks.
